Lacombe County establishes disaster recovery registration centre

(Lacombe, Alberta) – Lacombe County residents impacted by the flooding in Central Alberta this past spring are invited to apply to the Central Alberta Disaster Recovery Program for compensation for any uninsurable damage resulting from this extreme weather.

Date: **Tuesday, October 23**
Time: **10 a.m. to 8 p.m.**
Location: **Lacombe Memorial Centre (5214 - 50 Avenue)**

A Statement of Loss and Damage must be completed at the time of registration. Residents are also requested to provide the following when submitting their application:

- A detailed list of all property damaged or destroyed
- Photo identification and proof of residence (such as a utility bill)
- Insurance information including the name of the insurance agent/broker, the date the agent/broker was notified of the damage and loss, as well as a letter from the insurance company clearly stating what damage was not covered

The program will only cover those items or property not covered by the applicant's insurance policy, and does not provide for non-essential items. A detailed list of the limitations established for specific items is available on the Lacombe County web site at www.lacombecounty.com.

Residents unable to attend the registration centre on October 23 are welcome to apply in person at the Lacombe County Administration Office following that date during regular business hours.
